



MEASURE "B"

The Colusa City Council unanimously placed Measure B on the November 8, 2022, local ballot. If enacted, Measure B would provide locally controlled funding for Colusa. The State cannot take this money if it is approved.

KEEPING COLUSA SAFE AND PREPARED

Colusa's health and safety continue to be the City's top priority. If enacted, Measure B would provide local funding for City services with local control over local needs, including emergencies, road repair and safety, and other city services.

MAINTAINING ESSENTIAL CITY SERVICES

In community outreach and engagement, residents identified top priorities the City should address and maintain. Priorities Measure B could address include:

- Ensuring adequate police and fire staffing
- Keeping public areas safe and clean
- Repairing streets, roads, and potholes
- Maintenance of trees and parks

Colusa strives to keep our community a safe, prepared, and well-maintained City. We cannot depend on the state or federal government to adequately address our local needs, recovery efforts, and community priorities. If enacted, Measure B funding would help our fiscal stability and help ensure we are prepared for any future public health, safety, or other natural disasters.

ACCOUNTABILITY AND LOCAL CONTROL

- All Measure B funding would remain local
- No Measure B funding could be taken by the State
- Public disclosure of all Measure B spending
- An Independent Citizens Oversight Committee would review all Measure B expenditures.
- Sunset after four years
