



City Council & Commission Highlights — February 2026

The City of Colusa City Council held its regular meeting on February 3rd. The Council opened the evening with a 10-Year Service Award presented to Steven Jimenez, recognizing his dedicated contributions to the City.

On the business side, the Council approved several important items. Mike Griffith was appointed as the City's representative to the Colusa Mosquito Abatement Board, restoring direct city representation on a body that plays a key role in protecting public health. The Council also approved an exciting community partnership: a commitment of up to \$60,000 from the Parks Impact Fee Fund to the Colusa Rotary Club for the construction of four pickleball courts at Sankey-Elmwood Park. The project will be built in phases, with two courts fully operational in Phase One, and no General Fund dollars used.

The Council authorized the Police Chief to purchase a new 2026 Chevy Tahoe police vehicle from Hoblit Motors through the State Contract — funded through the SLESF grant — to support the department's recently expanded roster of officers. The Council also approved a revised meeting schedule for the Measure B Citizens' Oversight Committee, moving regular quarterly meetings to the second Wednesday of each quarter to improve attendance and scheduling efficiency.

A public hearing was conducted to gather community input on potential Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) activities and funding priorities — part of the City's ongoing effort to pursue federal funding for projects benefiting low- and moderate-income residents.

Please note: The February 17th City Council meeting, the February 4th Planning Commission, and the February 10th Heritage Preservation Commission meetings were all canceled. No commission activity occurred during those weeks.

The City Council held its first regular meeting of March on Tuesday, March 3rd. The evening opened with two special presentations: a 10-Year Service Award to Tina Dixon, and an informational presentation by representatives from California Rural Legal Assistance, Inc. (CRLA) on general legal services available to the community and the City's obligations under Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing (AFFH).

On the consent calendar, the Council approved the draft minutes from the January 20th and February 3rd meetings, received Finance Department reports for November and December, and approved warrant lists for both months. The Council also adopted resolutions authorizing the City Manager to execute a Joint Powers Agreement and to sign a purchase agreement with GapVax for a new water and wastewater vacuum truck with hydrojet — a key piece of equipment for maintaining the City's utility infrastructure.

Under Council Consideration, the Council took up three substantive items: adoption of the FY 2024–2025 Annual Audit and Single Audit reports; approval of the Mid-Year Budget Update and proposed budget adjustments for FY 2025–2026, along with the updated GANN Limit for both fiscal years; and approval of the Wastewater Annexation #2 Tax Share Agreement between the City and County of Colusa.
